K-ONE'S CORPORATE SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY (CSR) PROGRAMS AT ORANG ASLI VILLAGE AT ULU BATU, SELANGOR

On 16 December 2017, K-One staff whizzed its way to the Orang Asli Village at Ulu Batu at the fringe of Selangor to join hands with the Department of Orang Asli (JAKOA), Malaysian First Aid Society (MyFAST) and the Malaysian Youth Volunteering Programme (MyCorps) to participate in some meaningful CSR programs.

The Orang Asli Village at Ulu Batu is situated about 46km from K-One's PJ HQ. The villagers are mainly from the Temuan tribe consisting of around 150 members from 30 families. There are about 50 children in the village.

The programs' objective is to provide social services to the villagers and to prepare the children for the coming back-to-school session. It was also intended to give our staff a glimpse of how our indigenous communities live.
